



Bridgend Highway Reinstatement Contract

Case Study



Background

This contract consisted of construction, repair and maintenance of carriageways and footways throughout the Bridgend Catchment Area. Work packages vary from larger one-off schemes of values up to £200k, to minor repair/reactive maintenance works to carriageways, footways and iron work of values between £500 and £5k.

Works were carried out at various locations across the Bridgend County Borough Council highway network including busy town centres, high speed dual carriageways, residential areas, rural lanes, outside schools and in commercial areas.

Delivery

Activities undertaken as part of this contract included:

- Kerbing;
- Tactile and footway paving;
- Drainage/ducting installations;
- Street lighting and signage;
- Street furniture;
- Footway construction, reinstatement and resurfacing;
- Carriageway construction, reinstatement and resurfacing;
- Road marking application; and
- Landscaping.

Outcome

The safety of the traveling public and our own human resources is a priority on each and every scheme. Traffic and pedestrian management was provided by our experienced in-house NHSS 12A, B & D accredited Traffic Management Division.

Our local depots, labour and plant enabled us to effectively manage the fluctuating workloads often experienced with this type of contract. We were also responsible for community liaison and engagement including letter drops where required.
