









Cardiff Central

Case Study



Background

Centregreat Rail was contracted by Network Rail to undertake works on the Grade II listed building that is Cardiff Central Station. The work was in a highly congested area and consideration had to be taken of the requirement for increased capacity during match days.

Safety, accessibility and customer experience during the works were all critical to the successful delivery of the project. The refurbishment works at such an iconic station, the gateway to Wales' capital city, were all part of enhancing the passenger experience, whilst retaining the history and extending the life of the station building for current and future generations alike.

Delivery

Project works included:

- Refurbishing the Clock Tower including timber preparation and painting internally and externally
- Building painting included handrails and parapets.
- Cleaning the station façade stone work with a DOFF cleaning System.
- Modifying the roof drainage.
- Scaffold Access was installed to the front and Roof of the Station.
- Additional works were later awarded for a new roof System to be installed to the adjacent retail M&S Store.

Outcome

The Cardiff Central works demonstrated Centregreat Rail's engineering capability in developing solutions, flexibility and ability to adapt quickly to challenging problems, whilst

still conducting works carefully and diligently in a high footfall passenger interface arena. We ensured the solutions were sensitive to the structure on which we worked, which on this occasion had Grade II listed building status.
